The Honors Program is pleased to announce the availability of a small number of Development Grants for students in the Program. The purpose of these grants is to help students take advantage of opportunities which provide for personal, intellectual, and academic growth, but which often provide little or no support, or have costs associated with participation. Internships, study abroad programs, and service work (generally out-of-state or in another country) are examples of such opportunities. Awards will be approximately \$500.

Applications will be evaluated according to how well a program enriches a student's course of study. For study abroad opportunities, priority will be given to students traveling abroad for the first time. The review committee will also consider the length of the study abroad, internship, or service opportunity.

Students must be members of the University Honors Program and enrolled full-time at KU.
